stressful! ***There are vanpools from many neighborhoods, and some are searching for riders.*** “I can’t live without my car,” you say? Most riders find that being on a vanpool is quite liberating; not to mention stress reducing when you let someone else fight the traffic. AND being on a vanpool could help you save money on gas and reduce wear and tear on your personal vehicle. When someone else drives and you spend less time in traffic, you’ll have time to catch up on email, read, or even take a nap!

Vanpooling is also a great networking tool because you get to know people from various departments on campus, doing a wide variety of jobs. You might actually meet someone who knows someone, if you’re looking for career advancement. And even better, you might make some new friends.

- Vanpool groups determine their own commuting schedule.
- Each vanpool has a primary and backup driver. They usually ride free or at a reduced price, depending on their arrangement.
- Riders board at a predesignated times and locations.
- Vanpools drop off riders at locations near their offices.
- Vanpooling offers a considerable cost savings over the course of the year in gas, wear and tear on your car, and reduced insure rates
- Program participants receive 10-days per quarter, free parking for those times when you need your car
